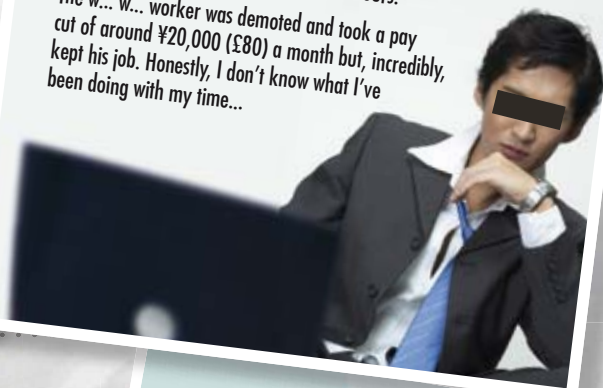
Dieter is thought to have hit hard times after a disastrous appearance on Henry Kelly-hosted 1990s überquiz, Going for Gold (probably).

IT just ain't what it used to be according a SAP-sponsored survey from the Economist Intelligence Unit.

The global poll of almost 1,000 people asked participants what they believed would be the key skills and talents needed to thrive in the workplace over the next three years – but just 14% of respondents thought information systems skills would be critical to their success.

While sourcing IT skills was noted as "very important" by just under half (45%), and a similar number (47%) thought that IT skills would be vital to their company's ability to succeed, less than 1 in 5 believed that technology skills would be the hardest to source. The "ability to manage change" topped the list of most sought after skills with 68%.
